What really happened at the cross?	Notes
Read chapter 1 beginning on page 5. It provides graphic detail on the reality of the crucifixion. (The session 2 video will offer a brief glimpse of the reality of the cross; however, you are encouraged to review it here in detail and allow the second video to reinforce it). After the reading, as the information sinks in:	
 Does this change what the cross means to you? How? 	
The next logical question is, "Why? Why would Jesus choose to suffer unthinkable agony and give up His life?" The answer is simple. One Word. Love.	
Let's explore the love of God the Father. John 3:16-17 below has been personalized. Insert your name and the names of family and friends if you wish. Then, read it out loud.	
For God so loved ME that He gave His only begotten Son, that <u>I</u> would not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn <u>ME</u> , but that <u>I</u> through Him might be saved	
Isn't it amazing that this kind of love is being extended to each one of us? We simply need to accept the incredible gift freely given to us.	
 Is there anything keeping you from truly accepting Jesus' sacrifice which was done for YOU? 	

Notes	Why was the cross necessary?
	In the Garden of Eden, man was created in the image of God to enjoy perfect fellowship with Him. And then sin entered the world through Adam and Eve.
	You may think, "I haven't done anything that bad. I've never killed anyone." At the bottom of page 13 in the book, sin is described as not simply doing terrible things, but living in the way we choose is best and not giving God His rightful place in our lives. Adam and Eve rejected the intimacy for which God created them. God created YOU for relationship with Him.
	What do you think about looking at sin in this way?
	 What types of things do people put on the throne of
	their lives in place of God?
	Take a moment to think of an area in your life that needs to change to give God His rightful place in your life?
	Romans 3:23 says, "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." Romans 6:23 says, "the wages of sin is death." Yet, throughout all human history, <i>God has always sought to restore that intimacy.</i>
	 In the Garden, God shed the blood of an innocent animal to cover Adam and Eve's bodies when they realized they were naked.

a Passover lamb and commanded animal sacrifice to cover the sins of His people once a year.	Notes
 In the New Testament, Jesus came to earth as the Lamb of God, the final sacrifice to atone for all sin – 	
past, present and future.	
You are encouraged to read pages 14-19 for more information on God's Old Testament and New Testament solutions for sin.	n

The scriptures on pages 18-19 are profound and describe just how much God wants to be in relationship with you. Take a few minutes to review them.

Notes	Read 1 John 4:9-10 on page 28. The word "propitiation" in verse 10 describes God's incredible love for you. God hates sin. The wrath of God against all sin past, present and future was put on Jesus on the cross. God is merciful to the person who believes in Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Jesus' sacrifice brings you back into right relationship with God, as it was in the Garden.
	God is Love
	⁸ He who does not love does not know God, for God is love . 1 John 4:8 (emphasis added)
	The essence of God is love. Love is who God is. He is not angry with you. God hates sin, not the sinner. You were delivered from the wrath of sin through Jesus' death on the Cross, His burial and resurrection. The immeasurable bounds of His love are described in Romans 8:35,38-39 on page 29. Personalize it and read it out loud to yourself.

Read John 3:36 on page 19. This is a harsh reality. You are either joined to God through belief in His Son and, as a result, have life or you are separated from Him and, as a result, you have deat and the wrath of God is upon you. There is no in-between.	e;
The love of the Father is expressed through the Cross and give us abundant life on earth and life in heaven forever with Him Your glorious intimate relationship with Him begins on eart and is made possible through the Cross.	າ
 Looking at your life today, can you describe it as joyful, peaceful, powerful and abundant? 	
 How would you benefit from having a more intimate relationship with God? 	
The Cross represents the awesome love of God. This love the love of God the Father, will transform your life if you trul receive it.	

Notes	Closing moughts
	You see now that the cross is more than a wooden structure. At first glance, it may represent the death of Jesus, but it's so much more. It's a symbol of Jesus' victory! It's the key to a life of joy, peace, and freedom. Living this transformed life begins with a revelation of the love of the Father in your heart, not just in your head.
	Praying scripture releases the power of the God's Word. It is in the Bible and as you appropriate these truths, you will grow in your faith walk.
	You are encouraged to pray Ephesians 3:14-21 on page 31 to close the session. Personalize it and pray it daily over yourself and friends and family. May you be strengthened and gain a fresh revelation of the love of the Father.
	In the next session, you'll look at how you experience the Father's love based on your life experience and how you grow in spiritual maturity over time.

Session 2:

Children of God

Let's Prepare

This session should end with an awareness of how the Bible defines the various stages of spiritual maturity, how to gauge where you are in that journey, and how to continue growing in your faith walk. A sense of amazement at the intimacy God wants with us should continue to keep us in awe of His great love.

Before watching the video, let's explore how you can experience God's love in your life.

Experiencing God's Love

In our last session, we discussed the love of God the Father. It is the most life-transforming experience a person can have. It will satisfy the greatest need you have. It will change you inside, heal your heart, set you free and totally transform every aspect of your life.

Developing an Accurate Image of God the Father

People tend to project their father's image onto our heavenly Father. Turn to p.41 in the book. Fold the page or cover the column on the right so only the column titled "Behavior of Parent" is visible.

- Check mark all behaviors that describe your earthly father or father figure (single mother, stepfather, grandparent, whoever filled the role of father).
- Now unfold the handout and read the "Misconception About God" that corresponds to each behavior.

The devil does not want you to experience the life-changing love of God the Father, so he attacks the family, especially fathers. If the attack is successful, it hurts the entire family and makes it harder for you to receive the love of God later in life.

notes	Forgive, Forgive
	By not forgiving or releasing judgments against your earthly father or anyone else, you limit your ability to receive God's love for you. For many, this is easier said than done, but is necessary. Forgiveness is the greatest expression of love there is. Let's see what scripture says about this.
	Do you struggle with unforgiveness toward your earthly father?
	How would you life change if you walked in forgiveness?
	³⁷ Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your
	heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' 38 This is the first and great commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' Matthew 22:37-39 (emphasis added)
	²⁰ If someone says, "I love God," and hates his brother, he is a liar; for he who does not love his brother whom he has seen, how can he love God whom he has not seen? 1 John 4:20 (emphasis added)
	Releasing every judgment you hold against your earthly father enables you to extend God's love to others. This will be discussed in more detail in session 6.

Renew Your Mind According to God's Word	Notes
Pray scripture to fight the lies of the enemy that fill your mind and keep you from forgiving.	
God is love. 1 John 4:8	
Below is a portion of what is commonly called the "Love Chapter". Substitute " <i>GOD</i> " for " <i>Love</i> ." Read it out loud. This is who God is.	
⁴ GOD suffers long. GOD is kind; GOD does not envy; GOD does not parade HIMSELF, GOD is not puffed up; ⁵ GOD does not behave rudely, GOD does not seek HIS own, GOD is not provoked, GOD thinks no evil; ⁶ GOD does not rejoice in iniquity. GOD rejoices in the truth. ⁸ GOD never fails. 1 Corinthians 13:4-6,8	
Fully Embrace Holy Spirit	
Holy Spirit is God and makes the love of God the Father real to you.Every person has a different life experience. At what	
age did you first hear about Holy Spirit? How has what you believe about Holy Spirit changed over time?	
⁹ But as it is written: "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man the things which God has prepared for those who love Him." ¹⁰ But God has revealed them to us	
through His Spirit. For the Spirit searches all things, yes, the deep	
things of God. ¹¹ For what man knows the things of a man except the spirit of the man which is in him? Even so no one knows the	
things of God except the Spirit of God. ¹² Now we have received , not	
the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, that we	
might know the things that have been freely given to us by God.	
1 Corinthians 2:9-12 (emphasis added)	

Notes	encouraged to do a word study on your own.
	Read Luke 3:21-22 on the bottom of page 37. It describes when John baptizes Jesus. Jesus did not need to be born again by the Holy Spirit. He was born of the Spirit in the first place and there was no sin in Him. Jesus was baptized to release the love of the Father and to empower Him to carry out His mission. You need that as well. Baptism will be discussed in more detail in session 5.
	To receive the love of God the Father, you must:
	 Realize your early father does not perfectly reflect or represent your Heavenly Father
	 Must obey God's command to forgive
	 Renew your mind according to God's Word
	Receive and fully embrace Holy Spirit
	After reflecting on this, watch the video and see how you can grow spiritually over time.
	Video Reflections
	Watch the video. Then, reflect on the following:
	 Every person has a different life experience. At what age did you first hear that the purpose of the cross was to blot out your sin? How has that awareness changed over time?
	1 John 2:12.14 on page 47 tells us that spiritual growth takes
	1 John 2:12-14 on page 47 tells us that spiritual growth takes place in at least three stages: 1) little children, 2) young men (and women), 3) fathers (and mothers). We all begin as little children. Today, let's see where you are on this progression and explore ways to continue growing.

Little Children	Notes
This first stage is learning and receiving in your heart that your sins are forgiven through the cross of Jesus.	
By sending His only Son Jesus to die on the cross for us, God chose to have those sins erased completely, blotted out fully. You are completely forgiven for sins of the past, present and future!	
 "Redemption" is a word you hear a lot in church, but not as much in daily life. What comes to mind when you hear the word "redemption?" 	
Read Vine's Expository Dictionary definition of redemption on page 48. You were born in sin because of Adam and Eve's sin in the Garden of Eden. The death penalty for sin was paid in full by Jesus on the cross.	
One of the greatest gifts He has given you is freedom from any guilt or shame from anything you may have done or may have been done to you in the past. Read Ann Billington's definitions of guilt and shame on page 49. • Guilt says, "You did something wrong." • Shame says, "You are faulty." • Guilt is a fact.	
Shame is a feeling.	
Having an awareness of doing something wrong (guilt) is healthy and prompts you to turn from it. It changes the way you think, allowing God to be the focus of your life. Living under the burden of that guilt is not healthy. It becomes condemnation and makes you feel hopeless.	
Shame fills your mind with lies from the enemy. You can accept Jesus' death on the Cross as immeasurable grace which covers all sin and shame. You can choose to let go of shame.	

Notes	much in daily life. Read 2 Corinthians 5:21 at the bottom of page 50. It says you are the "righteousness of God." • What comes to mind when you hear the word "righteous?"
	What does it mean to be the "righteousness of God?"
	You can choose to be in right relationship with God. You can choose to no longer focus on your past sin or how bad you think you are. That's a reason to rejoice and live in victory! Yes, you will continue to sin and must repent at every turn. God's desire is for Jesus' life, love and sacrifice to define who you are, not your past. • Take time in the next week to ask God to bring to mind any past sin or shame that may be keeping you from fully living in the victory of the Cross. You will have the opportunity to explore this in detail in the course entitled "Free Indeed."
	Young Men
	This is the stage where you become strong and overcome the enemy. You do this with the Word of God.
	Let's begin by clarifying some terminology we find in scripture. Read Romans 3:24-26 on page 53. Again, you read several words you may hear in church, but not as much in daily life. The following paragraph describes this passage as a courtroom trial. • "Propitiation" is the wrath of God against sin. All sin (past, present and future) was transferred and put upon Jesus at the Cross. If you accept His sacrifice on your behalf, you come into right relationship with God ("righteousness").

guilt (by God as judge) through "redemption" or payment (by Jesus on the Cross).	140169
Now, read 2 Corinthians 5:18-19 beginning at the bottom of page 54). Here you are introduced to being "reconciled." To be "reconciled" is to be brought into intimate relationship and friendship with God. At this stage, you are "in Christ."	oe
Read Romans 5:8-10 on page 55. Here you see that you were reconciled to God when you were still His enemy. God is not angry with you. He chooses to forget your sin when you confest. God wants you to live a life free from the guilt and shame the past.	ot
Read the series of passages on pages 55-57 which describe you position "in Christ."	ur
 Which passage jumps off the page and speaks to your heart? 	
Your friendship with God is your rightful place not because of anything you did, but because of what Jesus has already don You are now in Christ. This is your true identity. • How comfortable do you feel being a friend of God the Father? Are there cultural norms or religious traditions that may keep you from this type of intimate relationship?	

Notes	We have a place of favor with God if we choose to embrace living "in Christ."
	You just read in 2 Corinthians 5:17 on page 56 that a person in Christ is a new creation.
	 What does a person who is a new creation look like? How do they act? What do they say? How do you pick them out from the crowd?
	To become a new creation, the "young man" the Apostle John writes of, you must be strong in the Word and overcome the enemy. This can only be done by knowing and using the Word of God. Matthew 4:1-11 describes the temptation of Jesus by Satan. Feel free the full account before continuing. • In verse 4, when challenged by the devil to turn stones into bread, Jesus quoted scripture from Deuteronomy 8:3 saying, "It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." This is our model.
	How do you grow in the Word?
	17So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God. Romans 10:17 (emphasis added)
	The best place to hear the Word of God is out of your own mouth! Don't leave it to inspirational speakers to tell you what's in the bible. Read it for yourself, memorize it, stop and meditate on a particular verse or passage that seems to jump off the page at you. It's not how much scripture you read, but how much scripture gets into your heart.
	Let's look at the word "meditate."
	How does one meditate on the Word?

Do you have some practices you'd be willing to share?	Notes
Below are some tips to help you grow in the Word:	
 Before getting into the Word, pray for Holy Spirit to reveal a truth to you as you read and meditate. Begin your study expecting that revelation. 	
 Depending on the type of learner you are, it may help to engage all of your senses: read it, speak it aloud (not rote repetition), write it down. 	
 Remove distractions and think about the scripture. Reflect on it. You may choose to capture your thoughts and revelations in a journal. 	
You can overcome the enemy just as Christ overcame the temptation of the devil using the Word as a weapon.	
Fathers	
This is the stage where you express the life of Christ to the people around you through your life, actions and words. Fathers are:	
 Mature believers who know God (not just about God) Walking in their position as a child of God Not perfect 	
 Living in the love of the Father Becoming sensitive to the promptings of Holy Spirit 	
In the "young man" stage, you discover who you are in Christ. In the "father" stage, you discover who He is in you!	
God is a God of relationships. This stage is all about the 2-way loving relationships with God the Father and with one another.	
If you do anything or have any attitude that hurts your relationship with God, Holy Spirit will lovingly prompt you to change. It's not about following a strict rulebook of right and wrong or only doing good if there's some benefit in it for you; it's	

Notes	about constantly opening yourself up to hear Him as He reveals the paths He has called you to walk.
	Reviewing What Jesus Has Done for You
	As you grow into the <i>child stage</i> , you are redeemed by the blood of Jesus, completely forgiven, and made righteous (brought into right relationship) with God. This is the process of justification where you are formally acquitted of all sin, past, present and future.
	You grow in the <i>young man</i> stage by abiding in God's Word. This makes you strong in Christ and able to overcome the enemy.
	But, there's so much more. You can understand the basics of salvation, but may still not be living as a new creation in Christ This is the <i>father stage</i> . This is when you become more sensitive to your intimate friendship with God. It becomes all about your loving relationships with God the Father and with one another. • Examine your heart attitude as you go through your day. Are you experiencing the fullness of what Jesus
	did for you at the Cross?
	 Does your life reflect the joy of being in right relationship with God, living as one in the position of being in the family of God?
	Which stage most accurately describes where you are in your journey of faith?

If you wish to grow in your faith and accept the gift of being adopted into the family of God, personalize Romans 8:15-17 on page 61 and pray this scripture over yourself.	Notes
Closing	
Release the power of the God's Word by praying Ephesians 1:3-13 beginning on page 208. Do this daily over yourself and others. May you be strengthened and gain a fresh revelation of who you are in Christ.	
In our next session, we'll look at the greatest victory in the history of the world which, at the time, looked like the greatest defeat of all time.

Notes	Our Inheritance
	Review the scriptures on page 70. In short, what you get in this exchange as an heir is:
	 Every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places (Ephesians 1:3)
	 All things that pertain to life and godliness (2 Peter 1:3)
	Heirs of God
	God is holding nothing back. Read Galatians 3:26-29 at the bottom of p 70.
	 How do you become an heir of God?
	Through faith in Jesus Christ; His life, death and resurrection. You do nothing in exchange except believe. It's a God-way transaction once you believe.
	All the covenant promises God made to Abraham in the Old Testament through the promises Jesus made in the New Testament are yours to embrace. You can trust God to keep every promise He has made.
	If you are skeptical at all about whether you really are an heir, read Galatians 4:4-7 on page 71.
	 How do you know deep down inside that you are God's child?
	 Holy Spirit is your helper. Have you become more familiar with the works of the Holy Spirit in the lives of believers? This will be explored in greater detail in session 6 and throughout this equipping series.

The Exchange	Notes
The Cross of Jesus Christ represents the most awesome, yet most unfair, exchange in human history. He was sinless, yet ne took all the sin, guilt, shame, sickness, rejection and pain of every person who would ever live. Read the scriptures on p. 72:	
 Ephesians 2:1, 4-8 Isaiah 53:3-5 	
• Isaiah 53:10	
 What has God given you in return for the sacrifice of His only Son? 	
 Why would it please God for His Son to go to the Cross for you?

THE CROSS THE POWER OF GOD

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved, it is the power of God. 1Corinthians 1:18

The cross represents the greatest victory in all of world history. There, Jesus gave up His life for you and for me in an exchange that impacts every area of our lives. It is time for us to know the truth of the power of the cross so that we can experience everything Jesus died to provide for us.

THE CROSS PROMISES...

FORGIVENESS: Jesus was punished [by the Father] so that we could be forgiven. See Isaiah 53:3-5; Colossians 1:14

RIGHT STANDING WITH GOD: Jesus was made sin with our sinfulness so that we could be made the righteousness of God. See Isaiah 53:10; 2Corinthians 5:21

COMPLETE ACCEPTANCE: Jesus was rejected so we could be accepted in the beloved, and we are no longer rejected. See Isaiah 53:3-4; Ephesians 1:3-6

BEING JOINED TO GOD: Jesus was cut off by death so that we could be joined to God. See Hebrews 2:9; Romans 5:8; Ephesians 2:4-6

SHARING HIS GLORY: Jesus bore our shame so that we could be free from guilt and share in His glory.

See Isaiah 53:3; Matthew 27:26-31; Hebrews 2:10

HEALING: Jesus was wounded, taking our pain and sickness so that we could be healed. See Isaiah 53:3-5; Matthew 8:16-17; 1Peter 2:24

FINANCIAL ABUNDANCE: Jesus became poor so that we could share in His abundance. See 2Corinthians 8:9; 2Corinthians 9:8

BLESSING: Jesus was made a curse so that we could receive the blessing of Abraham, the promise of the Holy Spirit.

See Galatians 3:13-14

LIFE: Jesus died our death so that we could share in His life. See John 10:11; John 17:21; John 11:25-26

A NEW CREATION: Jesus was buried, but raised from the grave so that we could be raised in newness of life.

See 2Corinthians 5:17; Galatians 6:15

Notes	exchange:
	 Highlight a nugget of truth that jumps off the page at you. Add to the examples below.
	 Ask yourself, "What am I currently experiencing or have experienced in the past that I need to let go of in exchange for what God has for me?"
	Exchanged Punishment for Forgiveness
	 Jesus was wounded for your transgressions (crossing the line, committing an offense) and crushed for your iniquities (grossly immoral acts). The American Heritage Dictionary definitions are noted in parentheses.
	 Why would Jesus choose to do this? So you could be completely 100% forgiven for all past, present and future sins! So you could drop those burdens and live a new life in Him.
	Exchanged Sin for Righteousness
	 You will continue to sin. If you confess our sin (which means agreeing with God about your sinful attitude and actions) and turn away from it, he will cleanse you of all unrighteouseness and bring you back into a right relationship with Him.
	Exchanged Rejection for Acceptance
	 God's kind of love is the Greek word "agape." It is unconditional love. God chose you before the foundation of the earth and adopted you into the family of God! You don't need to do anything but believe to receive this agape love.
	 Exchanged Separation from God for Reconciliation (Chosen in Him) It's all about relationships. You were cut off from the Father by Adam and Even's sin in the Garden of Eden. Jesus was cut off from the Father when He became your sin on the Cross. Jesus was reconciled back to the Father by His death and resurrection. Now, you too are reconciled to the Father. He did it all!

Exchanged Shame for Glory and Honor	Notes
 You have the power to get rid of any emotional pain, guilt and shame and instead have everlasting joy in all situations because you were chosen by the King, the God of all creation. 	
Exchanged Pain and Sickness for Healing	
 This could refer to emotional, spiritual or physical healing. You can pray and believe for healing for yourself and others. 	
Exchanged Lack for Abundance	
 God wants to bless and provide for His children. God is a giver. He gave you Jesus, life and agape love. You should be a giver too. You are to be as generous as God is, with your finances, time, talents and any other resources God has given you. 	
Exchanged Curses for Blessings	
 God is a generational God. If you are aware of something bad that runs in your family (i.e., addiction, depression, poverty mindset), you have the power to speak against it and stop it in your generation. 	
Exchanged Death for Life	
 You can rest assured that you don't need to fear dying. You will get to see the Lord as He really is and be with Him for eternity! 	
Walking in Newness of Life	
 In Christ, you are not just fixed up, bandaged or repaired. You are a new creation! 	
Now, recite the list and personalize it: "Jesus" <insert exchange="">; "I am <insert promise="">.</insert></insert>	
For example: "Jesus was punished." "I am forgiven."	
Have you truly received all these exchanges?	
 Are you ready to exchange all the negative things in your life for the abundant life and victory?

Notes	Pray this week and allow God to reveal in what ways you have already received the Exchange of the Cross. If there are any areas they have not fully accepted, review the scriptures associated with the exchange and pray and meditate on those scriptures. Remember, meditating on scripture does not involve emptying your mind, but filling it with God's Word.
	Receiving by Faith
	You receive the work of the Cross by faith and faith alone. What does scripture tell us about faith?
	¹ Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. ⁶ But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. Hebrews 11:1,6 (emphasis added)
	Any inheritance is based on promises, and God's Word is His promise to you. You can trust Him to fulfill every promise He has made toward those who believe. Hebrews 10:23 tells us that "He who promised is faithful".
	 Galatians 3:26-27,29 can be found on page 207. As co-heirs with Jesus Christ, you have received the blessing of Abraham. Are you familiar with the story of Abraham in the Old Testament? Take a few minutes to read Romans 4:13-25 to read this amazing account of faith. As you read, put yourself in the story. Also read Genesis 22:1-14 which tells the story of God asking Abraham to sacrifice his son Isaac. If you were in Abraham's place, could you have endured waiting for what seemed impossible? Could you have trusted God with the life of your son, the son of His promise?
	Abraham surely must have believed that:
	 "God gives life to the dead" – Romans 4:17
	 "God calls those things which do not exist as though they did" – Romans 4:17
	• "God is able to perform what He has promised" – Romans 4:21

God gives life to things and situations that appear "dead" or impossible in your life. That is the message of the Cross. God is the Creator and you must believe in His ability to bring all things into being in your lives.	Notes
Hebrews 6:12-15 on pages 97-98 says that Abraham inherited the promise through <u>faith</u> and <u>patience</u> . How could he remain faithful in the waiting?	
Abraham did not set his mind on the facts of his situation but chose instead to focus on God and declare His glory. The circumstances and facts concerning your situation will change. You must stay focused on the truth of God's Word, which never changes. Keep in mind the wisdom of Hebrews 6:18 on page 98: • God never changes. Malachi 3:6 reinforces this: "For I am the Lord, I do not change." • God never lies.	
These two truths gave Abraham hope to endure patiently.	
God wants you to know that you can overcome unbelief and that you have the faith you need to make great things happen. Read Matthew 17:20 in the middle of page 99. You too can move mountains! When you set your mind on praising and worshiping God in all situations, your problems will not seem as overwhelming, and you will be at peace.	
Taking Action	
Unless you hear, read, and study His Word, you will not know what you have inherited. Read the scriptures in the section titled "Abide in the Word" on page 104. • John 8:31 • Romans 10:17 • Joshua 1:8 • John 8:32	
Meditate on the Word by speaking, hearing and thinking on it as a cow chews its cud. Do this not to get something from God, but because it is truth and truth makes you free.	

Notes	Still experiencing doubts?
	 Do you have doubts about putting your faith fully in Christ and accepting the Exchange of the Cross?
	 Are you focused on a situation in your life that you think God can't fix or can't work through?
	 Do you find yourself giving up in some areas of your life because the voice in your head is telling you the situation will never change?
	As discussed in the "young man" stage, you must continue spending time with the Lord in prayer and studying His Word. The better you know God, the more you will trust Him and the less you will doubt.
	Use the Doubt Extinguishers Worksheet in Appendix A to identify some root causes of unbelief and see if any apply to you. Then meditate on the scriptures provided to overcome it.
	Closing
	Praying scripture releases the power of the God's Word. You are encouraged to pray Ephesians 1:3-13 page 209 daily over yourself and others. May you be strengthened and gain a fresh revelation of who you are in Christ.

	Scripture tells us that God had a purpose for sending Jesus to die on the cross and be resurrected to secure a victory for us. Before Jesus' death on the Cross and resurrection, He told his disciples His purpose for coming – to defeat the enemy.
	 27"Now My soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save Me from this hour'? But for this purpose I came to this hour. 31Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be cast out. John 12:27, 31 (emphasis added)
	Also read 1 John 3:8 and John 16:8-11 on page 126. They refer to the "ruler of the world" and the devil being judged. Up to this point, we have hardly mentioned the devil.
	Looking back on your life, what have you believed about the devil?
	Do you believe the devil and demons are real and active in world today? If so, how?
	You need to know you have a real enemy who is bent on your destruction. Let's see what scripture has to say about this.

Notes	of the twelve disciples in preaching the Kingdom of God. Here we see that He also sent an additional seventy, believers just like you. He knows you can accomplish these tasks because of the authority He has given you. He also said He would be with you always.
	The devil no longer has any authority, but still has power. When you choose to sin, you give up some of that authority. "In Christ," you have authority and by the Holy Spirit, you have power. As you walk in fellowship with God, you can operate in both. Your authority in Christ trumps the devil's power. Jesus' victory is your victory.
	Do you understand how the power of Holy Spirit works in you to defeat the enemy? This will be addressed in more detail in sessions 5 and 6.
	Read Revelation 12:10-11 beginning at the bottom of page 131. In session 2, we discussed the transition from "little children" to "young men" to "fathers." You exercise your authority as you mature spiritually and abide in the Word. Be strong in the Word of God and use it to overcome the devil. The more you exercise your authority, the stronger your faith will become. The victory is sealed, you simply must exercise it.

To fully appropriate the power of the Cross, you must understand what it means to identify with Jesus Christ so you can understand the benefits that belong to you in Him. Dictionary.com defines the verb "appropriate" as follows: to take for oneself, to take possession of. This session, you'll look at the benefits you are authorized to take and use in Christ.

Read Romans 5:12-21 beginning on page 143.

- Adam's disobedience is why all man is born with a sinful nature. Romans 6:23 tell
 us, "the wages of sin is death." It is our nature to identify with sin and death. It
 separates us from God. This is the kingdom of darkness.
- Jesus was obedient to death on the Cross. Jesus paid for all sin at the Cross once and for all, allowing you to be born again and no longer be separated from God. Colossians 1:13 tells us, "He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love."

Read 1 Corinthians 15:45-47 on page 145. Understanding the truth of who Jesus is helps you identify with Him. In Jesus, there is life! You are forgiven and forever dead to sin.

Your New Life
When you identify with Christ, He shows you by grace that you have received His salvation and can now live in the in the fullness of everything Jesus has done for you.
What does it mean to you when you hear the term "born again?"
Have you experienced this in your life?
What do you do with the knowledge that, in Christ, you are freely forgiven and restored to right relationship with God? Read Romans 6:1-5 on page 145.
 In verse 1, Paul instructs us not to continue in sin simply because grace is available to cover it. Instead, identify with Christ completely and consider yourself dead to sin.
 Water baptism doesn't save you; it is an expression of your total identity in Christ.
 As you are fully immersed in the water, you are identifying with the death of Christ.
As you come up out of the water, you identify with His resurrection and are raised to walk in the newness of life.
Water baptism is not something you do simply because the church says you should or even because scriptures command it.
Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:19
_

baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." Acts 2:38	Notes
You are to be water baptized because to do so is to follow Jesus' example.	
13Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him. 14 And John tried to prevent Him, saying, "I need to be baptized by You, and are You coming to me?" 15 But Jesus answered and said to him, "Permit it to be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Notes	 Were you aware that salvation is not the end goal of your faith walk?

	Anyone in Christ is a new creation and Christ lives in you. You will continue to sin. When you do, focus on Jesus and all He did for you. You are the righteousness of God. Remember, God hates sin, but God loves you. You will inevitably become what you focus on.
	Dead to the World
	Read 1 John 5:19 on page 150. The world, and its powerful pull on us, has been defeated through the Cross. The world system is under the rule of the enemy.
	 What are the world's priorities? What is celebrated in society?
	What does it mean to be successful in today's society?

The world is full of temptations, but you can be dead to them **Notes** and identify with Christ. You do this by applying His overcoming power in your life and appropriating His victory. Read 1 John 2:15-16 on page 150. Review the three areas of temptations in the world on pages 150-151. Take a moment to honestly reflect on the meaning and possibility that one or more may have some control over your life. Lust of the flesh Lust of the eyes Pride of life Read the Parable of the Sower in Mark 4. Verse 7 says, "And some seed fell among thorns; and the thorns grew up and choked it, and it yielded no crop." Verses 18-19 say, "18 Now these are the ones sown among thorns; they are the ones who hear the word, 19 and the cares of this world, the deceitfulness of riches, and the desires for other things entering in choke the word, and it becomes unfruitful." In your life, have you experienced times when you fell for the temptations of the world, in big or small ways? Why is it difficult to resist the desire for things that are not of God? The good news is these earthly temptations do not have to rule or control our lives. Read 1 John 5:4-5 on page 151. Vain pursuits lure you away from who you really are in Christ. When you are dead to the world, the world's snares have no power over you. Your faith in Jesus and all He did for you overcomes the world.

Notes	Read Galatians 6:14 on page 150.
	 What does it mean to "boast in the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ?"
	This takes the focus off you and puts it squarely on the work of
	the Cross. This is how you are to live. This is especially important given the truth of John 16:33 on page 150. You will be constantly attacked and manipulated by the enemy. Instead of fighting the world and focusing on your situation, simply abide in Him and spend time in His Word to live in the peace of God.
	And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God. Romans 12:2
	How do you renew your mind and focus on God?
	Free from the Law
	When you completely identify with Jesus, you are dead to the world and dead to the law. The law is the idea that God accepts or rejects you based on your performance, what you do or don't do. There is nothing you can do to make yourself more or less acceptable to God. You are totally accepted and have His unfailing love and mercy. You need only receive it by faith.
	In Romans 7 (excerpts on page 152), Paul describes our relationship with Christ as a marriage. When you are in Christ, you are dead to the law and "married" to Him. His work on the Cross forged a powerful union and you are united with Him,

n His death and resurrection, completely identified with Him. Being dead to the law frees you from trying to perform to please God. All you have to do is have your heart right before Him and receive and appropriate by faith all He has for you.	Notes
Why is it so difficult to live victoriously? You may not have major sin in your life, but your old sin nature persists. You may want to live out the amazing truths in Romans 6, but are stuck n Romans 7. Read Romans 7:15-24 on page 162. Count the personal pronouns (I, me, my) as you read it. Life should not be about "me;" it should be about Jesus, who gave His life for us and now lives in us. You simply cannot live out the truth of God's word in your own ability.	
In what ways might you be standing in the way of all God has for you?	
What actions can you take today to focus your mind on the truths of Romans 6?

	You must understand your identity in Christ
	 You must completely identify with His resurrection life because He is not in the grave, but is raised and lives forever. If you identify with His death, certainly you should identify with His resurrection.
	You must reckon yourself dead to sin and alive to God
	 Stop your old way of thinking. Turn from death to life in Christ. Say "no" to sin and "yes" to Christ and His life. You do all this by faith in what Jesus has done for you.
	Read Romans 6:13 on page 161. As you present every part of yourself to God, embrace your identity as a new creation, a saint, alive from the dead.
	 What does it mean to present your "members" to God?
	 What struggles can you present to God today? Do you believe He can deliver you from that situation or temptation?

If you let sin reign or have ahold of you, you are denying both the truth of God's Word and Jesus's work on the Cross. As you present yourself entirely to the Lord, you will enjoy intimate relationship with Him and a victorious life in Christ.	Notes

Watch the video and jot down notes on the opposite blank page. Read along with Terry on page 173 as he summarizes how every believer can appropriate all Jesus did at the Cross. Then, reflect on the following:

•	Do you believe what Jesus did on the Cross was a complete and eternal work?
•	Do you see yourself as dead to sin?
•	Do you identify completely with the resurrection of Jesus Christ?

Believing these promises in your heart is the key to receiving them in your life personally. As you apprehend and comprehend the fullness of what Jesus purchased on your behalf, you will walk in increasing wholeness, freedom and power.

Notes	How do you live in victory?
	Many people continue to struggle to appropriate and fully live in the power of everything Jesus provided. Read Matthew 16:24-25 on page 174. Jesus explains what is necessary to follow Him completely. This will result in living in the power of the Cross.
	Do you really desire to follow Jesus?
	Do you really want to be free and live in the victory and power of the Cross?
	 Do you want to gain eternal life, forever living in the presence of the King of kings and Lord of Lords?
	Deny Yourself
	Jesus tells His disciples they must deny themselves. This means you must choose to live your life according to the Word of God. You must deny the desires of your mind and flesh if they do not line up with God's will.
	Jesus also says you must lose your life, but not in a physical sense. The word "life" in this passage means "soul." Your soul is your mind, will, and emotions. They tend to be contrary to God's Word and to His Spirit. You must not allow them to have power over your life. Let's see what a soulish life, one ruled by the flesh instead of the Spirit, looks like.
	The Mind
	Intellectual knowledge is needed before anything can be believed and lived out. You may agree with the truth of God's Word, but you don't act on it.

• Emotions	Notes
Feelings drive and control you and influence decisions. Emotions change as your situation changes and, when inflamed, can result in high "highs" and low "lows."	
• The Will	
Strong-willed people do not move easily from their positions or opinions, even when they are contrary to God's will. Stubbornness is like idolatry in that it exalts your own views over the truth of God.	
 Do you relate to any of these soulish barriers? What does living in that manner look like in your life today? 	
Understanding the relationship between the spirit, the soul and the body is essential to maturing in Christ:	
 The human soul (mind, emotions, will) lives in our human body and comes under the rule of the spirit. As spirit beings, we can choose to be led by Holy Spirit or continue to live by the flesh and in defeat. 	
 The spirit of a believer is born again and should be in charge. A believer must learn to submit their soul (mind, emotions, will) and body to the spirit led by Holy Spirit to live in victory. 	
Take Up Your Cross Daily	
In the passage in Matthew, Jesus also tells His disciples they must take up their cross daily and follow Him. Every time you deny your soul (mind, emotions, will) the chance to rule over you and choose to obey His will, you are picking up your cross and following Him.	
Living soulishly in the flesh is being self-focused and self-centered. It's all about you. It is death.	
Living in the Spirit is being God-focused and God-centered. It's all about Him. It's life and peace. God is love ands God loves you. In Christ, you can love others as God loves you.

Notes
You must deny yourself the "right" for revenge and choose to obey the Word and forgive from the heart. Forgiveness is not a feeling. It does not say that what was done to you was okay. It is a choice to obey God's Word. It is literally love in action and requires you to deny yourself and walk by the Spirit. Your life on the other side of that choice to forgive shows the power of God in your life.	
No Condemnation	
Now, let's talk about receiving the Lord's forgiveness. Read Romans 8:1-4 on page 163. You must believe you are not condemned, but fully forgiven and free. One of Holy Spirit's roles is to "convict" you of sin.	
What comes to mind when you hear the word "convict?" Is it a good thing or a bad thing?	
What does the word "repentance" mean to you?	
 We've talked about the battle of the mind. This is how it works: Holy Spirit will convict you by pointing to a sinful attitude or behavior and tell you, "That is sin." You will never be condemned as a person. Holy Spirit loves you, but hates sin. 	

Notes	by saying, "You are a sinner."
	The devil hates you, and loves sin.
	 If you walk in all Jesus did for you through the Cross, there is no shame, guilt or condemnation. You can respond to Holy Spirit's conviction with repentance and turn away from that sin.

Insights from Terry

If you are interested in using the study guide to lead a study group, additional materials are included in this appendix. Prompts are included throughout the study guide to fuel group discussion.

Planning Your Time Together

This guide can be used to minister to small groups in churches and homes as well as large groups. A 90-minute session could include:

- 20 minutes Welcome and intro to the day's session
- 20 minutes Video using the study guide blank pages to jot down notes and insights
- 30 minutes Group reflection and discussion; a series of book readings and prompts are offered in the study guide (choose as many as you see fit)
- 10-minutes Prayer for the group (reflecting on the day's topic, personal requests)

Group Guidelines

If you are beginning your journey as a study leader, we recommend sharing guidelines to create an environment where all feel safe to share and ask questions as they absorb the teaching. There are many resources online for this type of information. Feel free to use this as a starting point.

- We will gather to grow in our relationship with Jesus.
- We will seek biblical truths.
- We will pray for one another at each meeting.

Whether you are an experienced teacher or just stepping out in faith in this area of gifting, consider teaming up with another believer to conduct this teaching. Each person lends a different insight into the scripture and each person's life experience may stimulate growth and discussion and offer encouragement to the group. These truths have been a blessing in my life.

You may also find it useful to share personal stories, if you feel comfortable doing so. This creates an atmosphere of authenticity, a feeling that the topics discussed pertain to real life. It also makes you more approachable to the members of the group who may be led to share their own stories or request more information and discussion outside the group setting.

Reading scripture aloud with "I" and "me" or inserting your own name brings the scripture to life in a more personal way. Inserting the names of friends and family members is a great way to pray scripture over others.

Thank you for sharing your gifts with the Body of Christ, His precious church, and to those who have yet to hear and understand the true message of the Cross.

Heavenly Father, I lift up your faithful servant. Strengthen and inspire them. Bless all who will hear the message of the cross of Jesus Christ through this teaching. Students will have the opportunity to explore roadblocks and doubts that hinder their faith walk. You may choose to do this during your time together or recommend it for independent study.

Welcoming the Group

Begin the discussion with a personal reflection on the stages discussed in the last session. Feel free to choose from the following:

- Reflecting on last session's teaching on the various stages of spiritual maturity, is there anything you'd like to share? What stage do you find yourself in ("child," "young man," or a "father")?
- ☐ This week, we'll discuss "The Exchange of the Cross." Let's look at the word "exchange." What sort of things do we exchange in daily life? (i.e., recipes, gifts, holiday cookies, cash vouchers for giving up your seat on an airplane, groceries for cash paid)
 - ☐ In most cases, it's give-and-take, a 2-way exchange.
 - ☐ Let's see what is required from us to get all God has for us when we accept the Exchange of the Cross.
